REFLECTION - 5TH SUNDAY OF LENT

But when they continued asking him, But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area,

But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without the straightened up and said to them,"

and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them.

Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle.

MCC Food Pantry:

We served 37 families consisting of 62 adults, 43 children and 26 seniors during the month of February. 18 of the 37 families utilized the pantry twice this month.

Our HACAP pick-ups are scheduled on Tuesday, March 22nd at 2:00 pm. We will need help unloading, shelving and bagging beginning around 2:45 on these days.

HACAP is holding a training session on delivering the highest quality food choices on March 23rd which I will be attending. Our Pantry should receive a \$750 donation from HACAP for attending this workshop. I will provide details in next month's updates.

The Stanwood Union Church Youth Group will be having it's second annual – **24 hour Hunger Challenge on March 12th.** Local youth will be collecting donations or food and money to purchase food for our pantry. If you are interested in donating or finding out more just let me know.

This was a great activity last year and the youth learned a lot about how much of a struggle it can be to purchase a variety of food, especially healthy food, when your budget is tight. The challenge will end and our fast will be broken when the group sits down to eat a hearty breakfast on Sunday morning. This year the Mechanicsville Youth Group will also be invited to participate in this challenge. We hope more youth means more pledges to support the food pantry and more random acts of kindness performed in both communities.

Our March distributions are scheduled for the following dates:

Thursday, March 24th 6:00 – 7:30 pm Saturday, March 26th 9:00 – 10:00 am

Our pantry is fairly well stocked. We could use the following types of items at the pantry: canned corn, peas, soup, canned fruit, canned meat and pasta.


Lent Challenge

March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

Life Line Screening will be offering preventive health screenings on Monday, March 21, 2016 at St. Mary's Parish Hall. As part of the screening event, Life Line Screening will offer *low-cost* takehome colorectal cancer tests called FIT (Fecal Immunochemical Test) in recognition of March as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month. These tests are simple, accurate, and recommended for the early detection of colorectal cancer. According to the Centers for Disease Control, the risk of developing colorectal cancer increases with age. More than 90% of cases occur in people aged 50 and older.

Other preventive screenings provided check for stroke risk, abdominal aortic aneurysms, and osteoporosis. **St. Mary's Catholic Church - Parish Hall** is pleased to make these important screenings available by hosting Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings.

Screenings are fast, painless and affordable. Three key tests check for blocked carotid arteries, an irregular heart rhythm called atrial fibrillation, and high blood pressure, which are the three leading risk factors for stroke. Strokes are the third leading cause of death in the U.S., yet, with preventive strategies, 80% of strokes can be prevented.

Other tests check for abdominal aortic aneurysms and hardening of the arteries in the legs. A bone density screening to assess osteoporosis risk is also offered and is appropriate for both men and women. Many events also offer blood tests, including cholesterol, glucose and c-reactive protein screenings.

Screening packages start at \$139. Single tests cost around \$70.
